The U. S. real gross domestic product rose at a 2.6 percent annual rate during the third quarter of 2010 and grew 3.2 percent since the third quarter of 2009.

Total civilian employment for the third quarter fell 0.1 percent compared to the corresponding period of the previous year.

A survey of forecasters by the Federal Reserve Bank of Philadelphia predicts the U.S. economy to grow 2.7 percent, 2.5 percent, and 2.9 percent in 2010, 2011 and 2012 respectively.

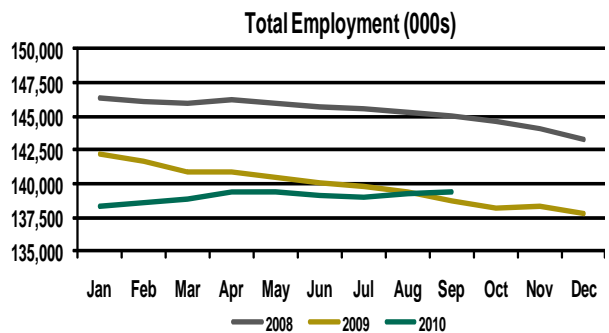
An alternative set of forecasts published by Wachovia Bank indicates gains of 2.9 percent, 2.7 percent, and 3.3 percent in 2010, 2011 and 2012.

## STATE

### Louisiana Economy

Total state employment for the third quarter of 2010 was 0.4 percent lower compared to the previous quarter but 1.4 percent above the level for the third quarter of 2009.

The unemployment rate for the third quarter was 7.5 percent, compared to 7.3 percent for the same quarter in 2009. The state experienced a rise in the unemployment rate in comparison to the previous quarter but was still significantly below the 9.6 percent national average.

State sales tax collections for the third quarter fell 10.5 percent compared to the prior quarter but were 5.3 percent higher than for the third quarter of 2009. This was the first year-over-year increase since the third quarter of 2008.

Louisiana's seasonally-adjusted personal income grew moderately in the third quarter of 2010, rising 0.8 percent over the prior quarter and 3.5 percent compared to the third quarter of 2009. The national average increase was 0.7 percent quarter over quarter and 3.6 percent over the past twelve months.

Separated into components, net earnings rose 1.1 percent during the third quarter of 2010, transfer receipts rose 1.5 percent, and dividends, interest, and rent fell 1.1 percent.

Louisiana's third quarter foreclosure activity increased 31.5 percent compared to the third quarter of 2009, averaging 1,927 notices or listings per month in 3Q2010 versus 1,465 in 3Q2009 (data from RealtyTrac.com).

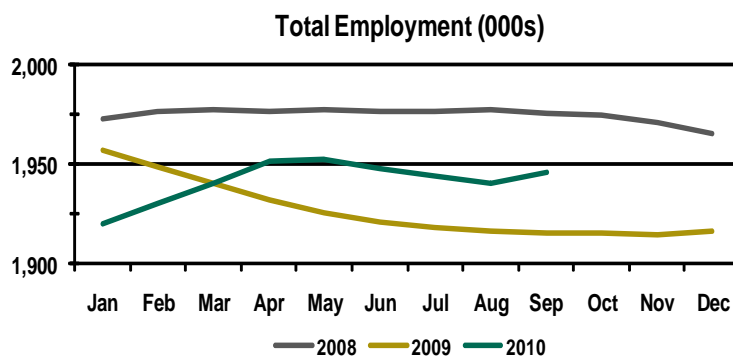

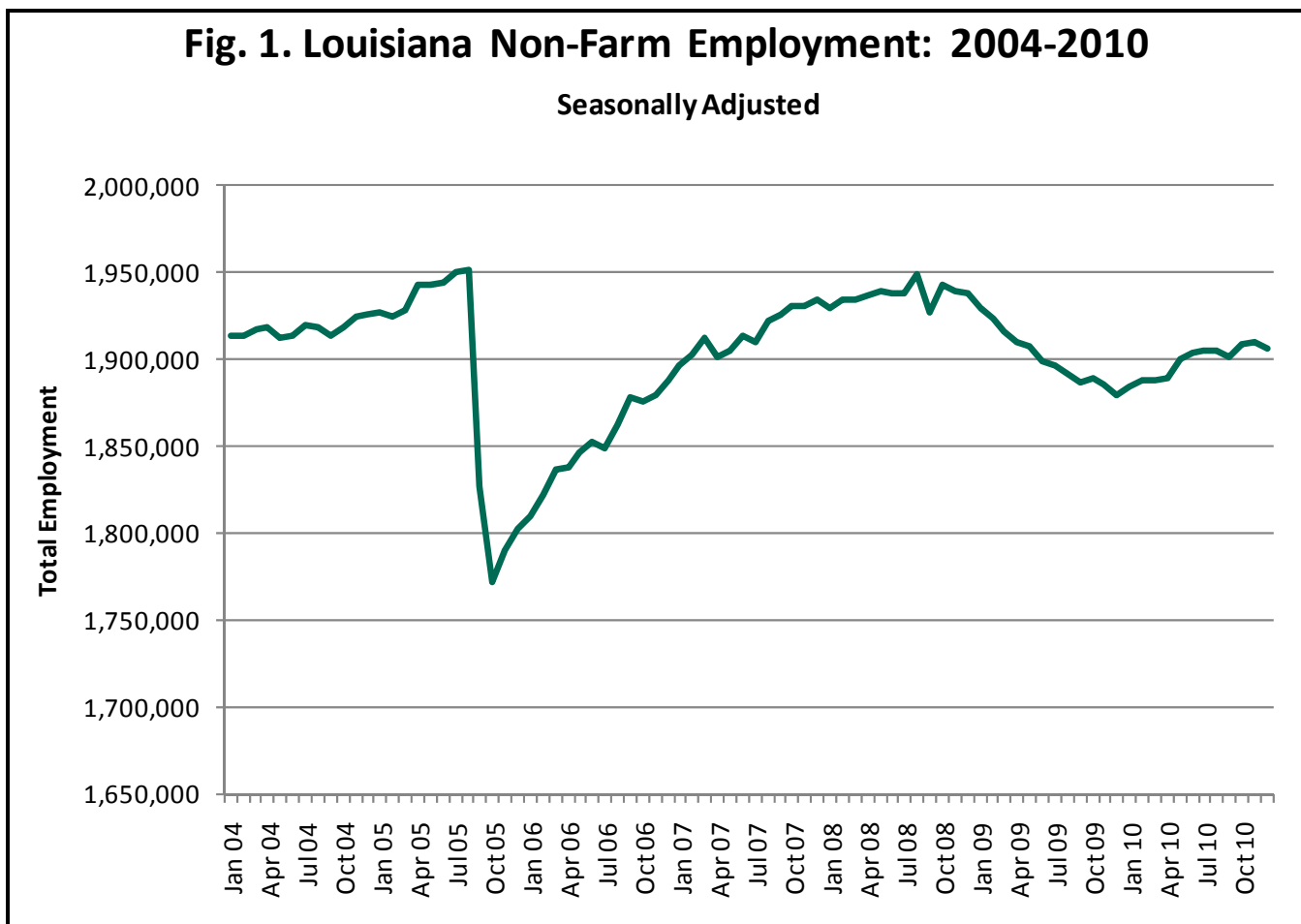
## Trends in Employment and Unemployment: Which Sectors and Occupations Have Suffered the Most in “The Great Recession”?

Louisiana’s total non-farm employment plummeted from 1.95 million in July 2005 to 1.77 million in October 2005, following the devastation and population exodus caused by hurricanes Katrina and Rita in August and September 2005 (Figure 1).

Non-farm employment had finally almost recovered to its pre-“KatRita” level by August 2008 when the near collapse of the U.S. financial system ushered the nation and state into “The Great Recession”.



Louisiana’s seasonally-adjusted, non-farm employment declined by almost 58,000 jobs (3.0 percent) from December 2008 to its low point in December 2009, compared to a 3.5 percent drop for the U.S. From December 2009 to December 2010, Louisiana’s seasonally-adjusted, non-farm employment grew by 26,500 jobs (1.4 percent), while the equivalent measure for the U.S. increased a smaller 0.9 percent.

So Louisiana’s employment didn’t fall as far as that of the nation and has recovered more during 2010. However, employment in December 2010 was still 31,200 (1.6 percent) below where it was in December 2008.

## Trends in Employment and Unemployment — *continued*

Hidden in these overall numbers are the differences in employment gains and losses by industry.

As shown in Figure 2, *Trade, Transportation, & Utilities* and *Total Government* are traditionally the two largest employment sectors in Louisiana, with each employing between 350,000 and 400,000 individuals. *Trade, Transportation, & Utilities* employment recovered more quickly after the storms of 2005, causing it to hold the top spot until August 2009, when recession-induced declines caused it to drop below the less-affected government sector.

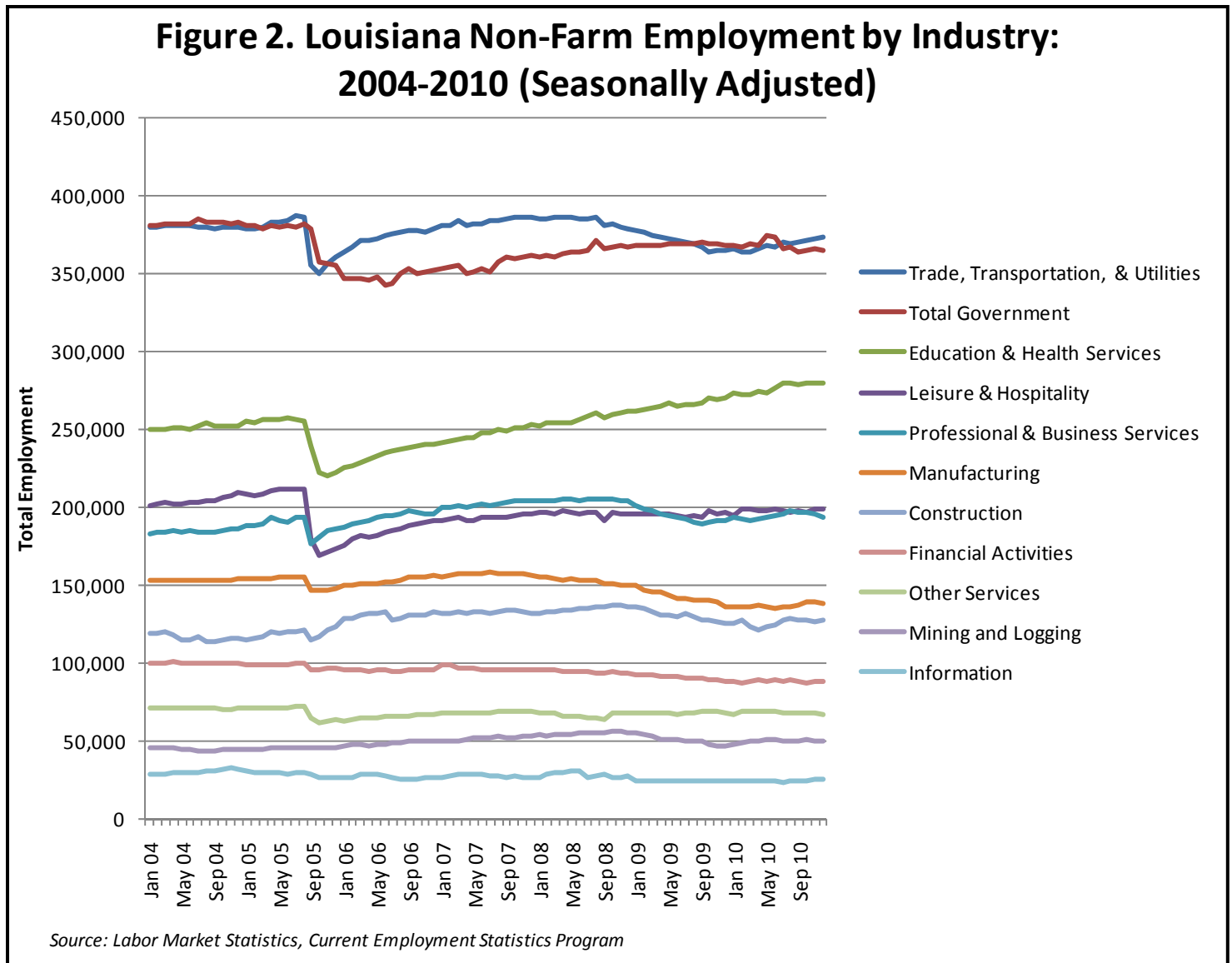
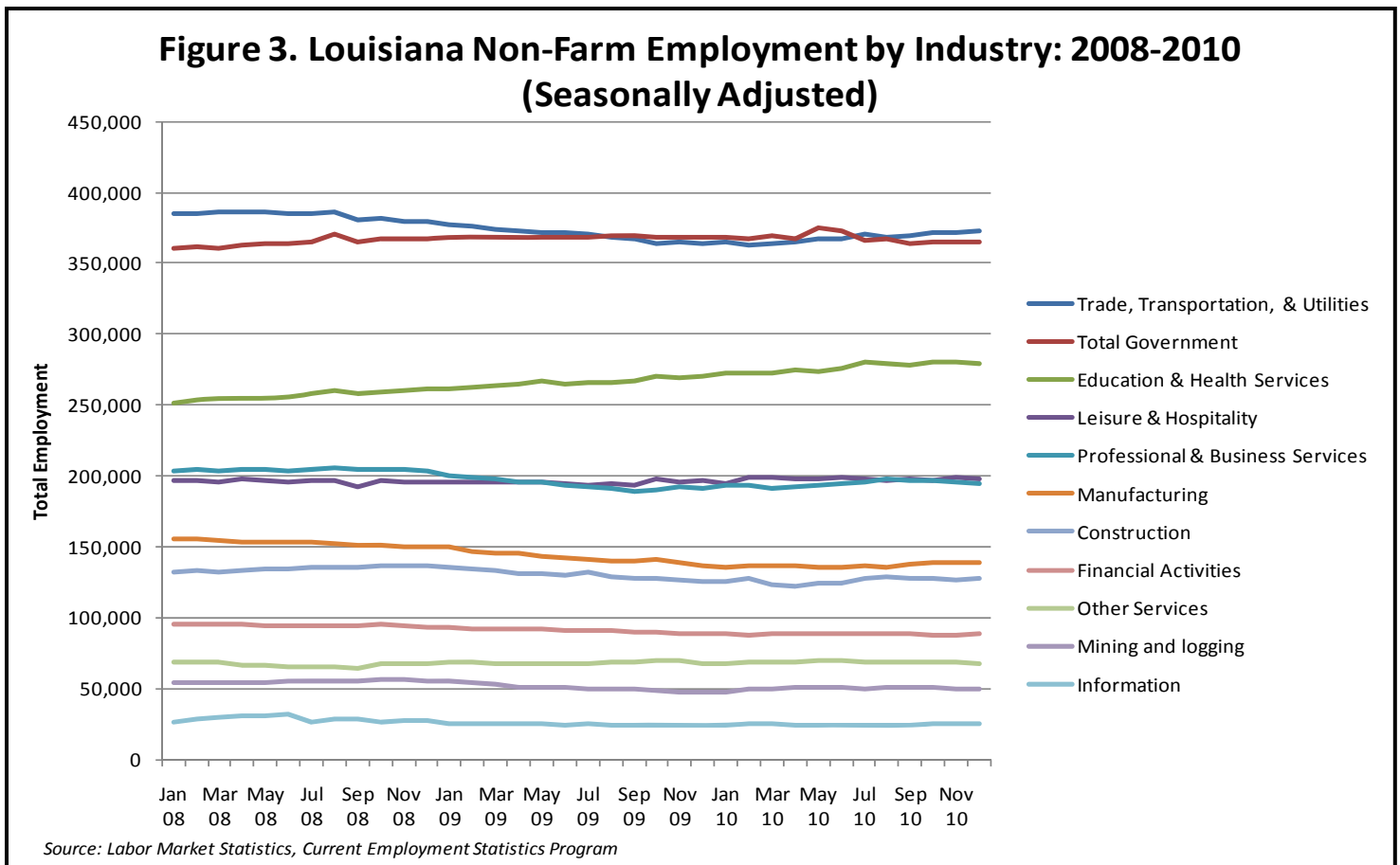


Figure 3 focuses on the 2008-2010 portion of Figure 2, allowing easier analysis of the effects of the economic downturn.

*Trade, Transportation, & Utilities* lost the most jobs from December 2008 to December 2009 (-14,700), while *Mining and Logging* (which includes oil and gas jobs) had the greatest percentage decline (-14.9 percent).

## Trends in Employment and Unemployment — *continued*



Three sectors gained jobs during 2009—*Total Government* (+1,100), *Education & Health Services* (+9,400), and *Leisure & Hospitality* (+700). *Total Government* lost 3,200 jobs in 2010, while *Education & Health Services* and *Leisure & Hospitality* gained 8,700 and 1,900, respectively, making them the only two sectors to have a net increase in employment from December 2008 to December 2010 (Figures 4 & 5).

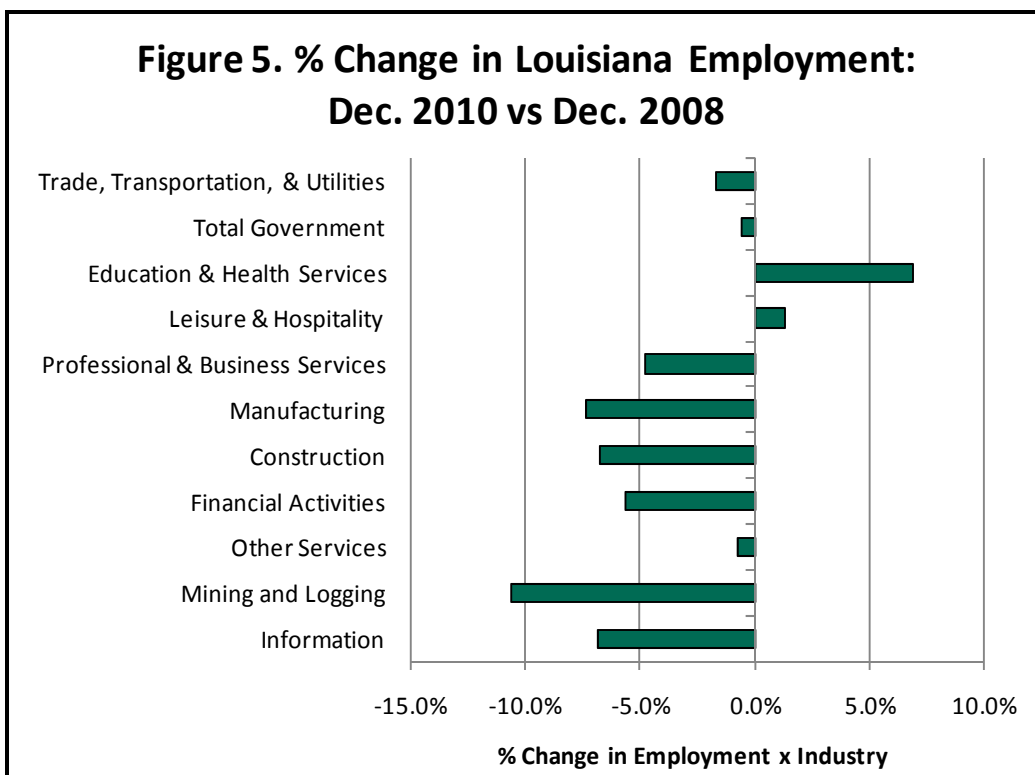
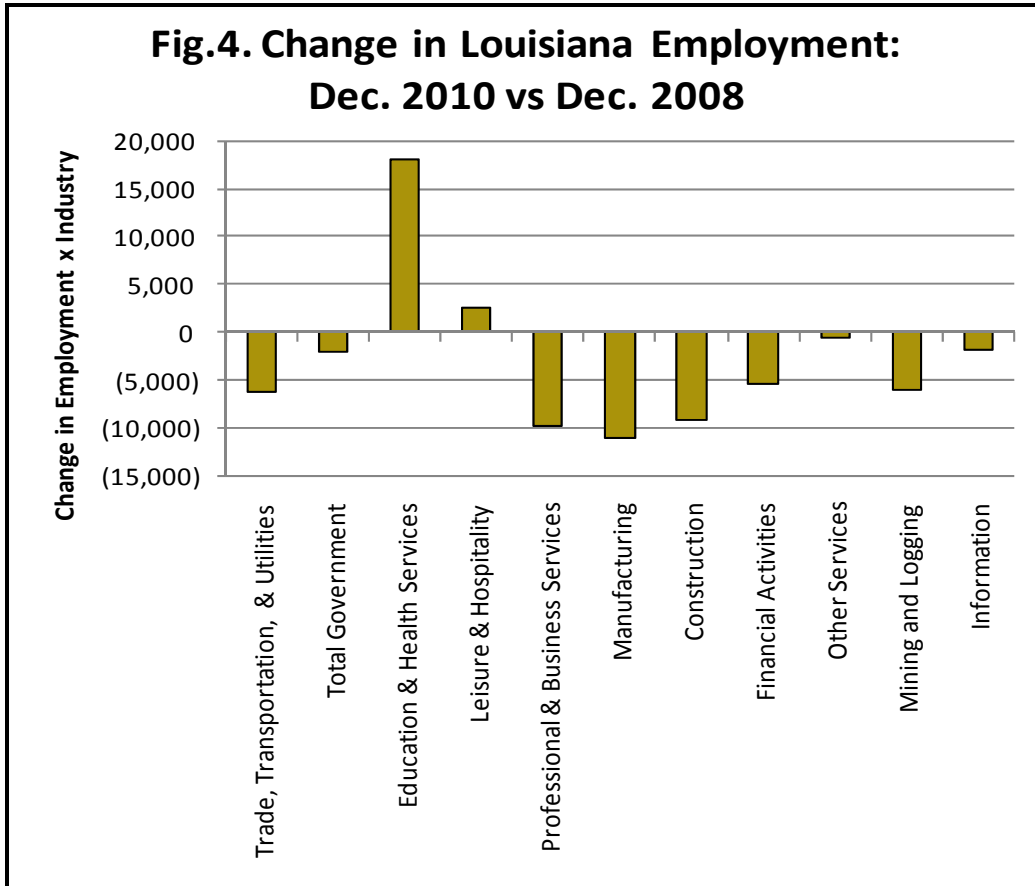
*Education & Health Services* and *Leisure & Hospitality* gained 18,100 and 2,600 jobs, respectively over the two year period (Figure 4). These represented respective increases of 6.9 percent and 1.3 percent (Figure 5).

*Manufacturing* lost the most jobs during the last two years, down 11,000, followed by *Professional and Business Services* (-9,700) and *Construction* (-9,200).

*Mining and Logging* had the greatest percentage decline (-10.6 percent), followed by *Manufacturing* (-7.3 percent), *Information* (-6.9 percent), and *Construction* (-6.7 percent).

The strong growth in *Education & Health Services* employment caused it to increase its share of total state non-farm employment from 13.5 percent in December 2008 to 14.6 percent in December 2010. *Leisure & Hospitality* increased from 10.1 to 10.4 percent, and *Total Government* from 18.9 to 19.1 percent. The shares for all other sectors were stable or declined.

### Drilling down in the industry data

Although seasonally-adjusted data are only available for 2010 for the broad (two-digit NAICS code) sector designations discussed previously, non-seasonally-adjusted data are available for more defined sub-sector designations. Drilling down into the sub-sector data reveals wide variability of employment gains and losses within the larger sector groupings (Table 1). Note that Table 1 is based only on the sub-sectors for which data was available from the Current Employment Statistics (CES) Program. Other sub-sectors may have had greater growth or declines than those listed.

Within the *Education and Health Services* sector, which had overall (non-adjusted) employment growth of 7.1 percent from 12/2008 to 12/2010, all reported sub-sectors showed positive employment growth over this period of national recession. Sub-sector growth ranged from 1.6 percent for *Nursing Care Facilities* to 16.0 percent (the highest of all reported sub-sectors) for *Home Health Care Services*.

In the *Leisure & Hospitality* sector, the other sector recording employment growth over this two-year period, sub-sector employment change ranged from +5.1 percent in the *Accommodation* sub-sector to -4.6 percent for the *Amusement, Gambling, & Recreation* sub-sector.

All of the nine two-digit sectors shown in Table 1 had at least one reported sub-sector with stable employment or growth except for *Financial Activities* and *Mining and Logging*, for which all reported sub-sectors showed employment declines. The most severe employment decline of any sub-sector was *Drilling Oil/Gas Wells* (within the *Mining and Logging* two-digit sector), which dropped 31.1 percent.

### Unemployment Claims by Occupation

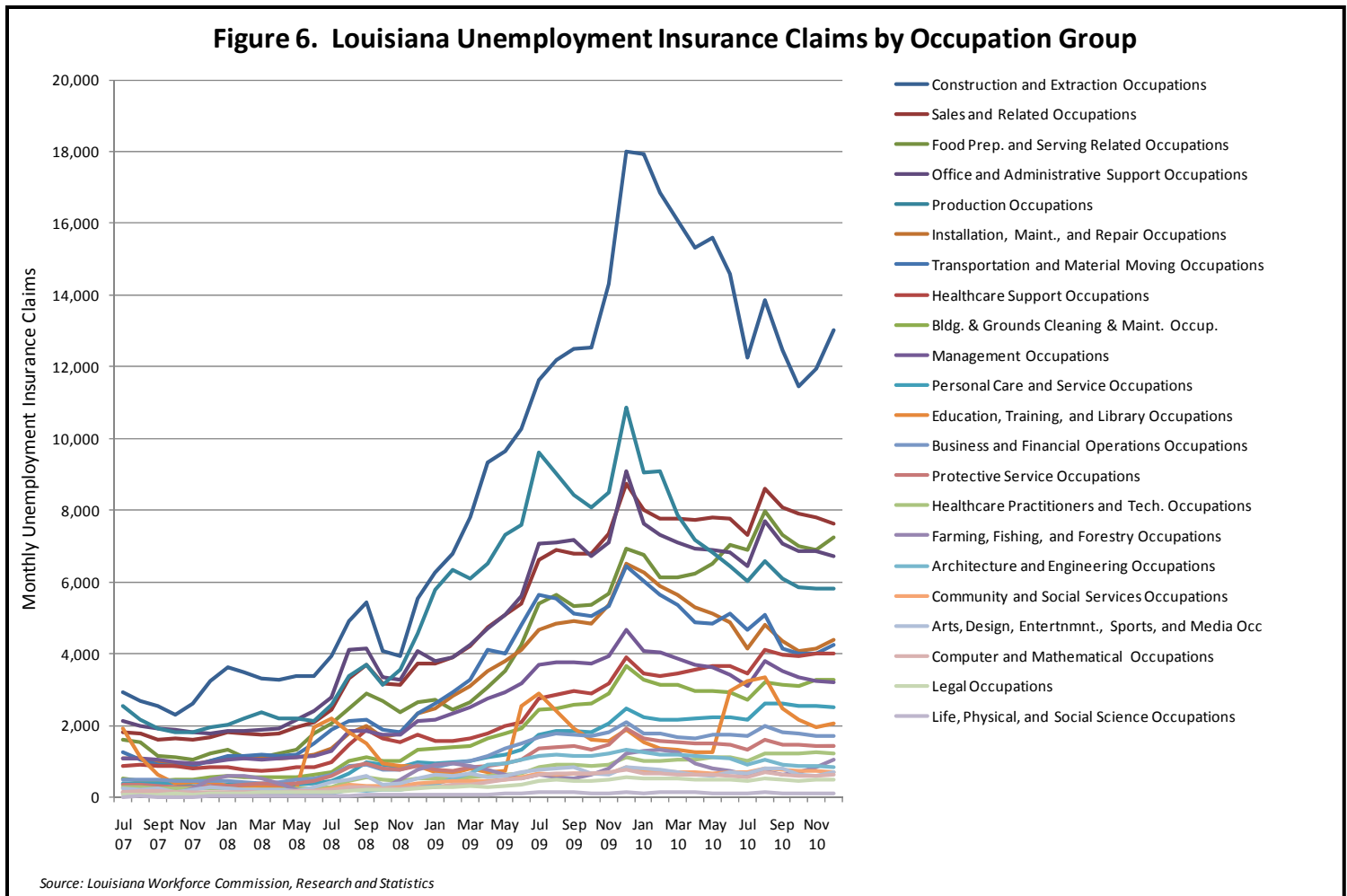
Each industry discussed in the previous sections may include numerous occupation types. For example, within the *Accommodations* sector would be employees with sales, office, maintenance, financial, and possibly food-service occupations.

In order to gain insight into which occupation types have been most impacted by the economic downturn, unemployment insurance claims for 22 occupation types as reported by the Louisiana Workforce Commission were analyzed to track trends and changes since the recession began.

## Trends in Employment and Unemployment — *continued*

December 2007, when 17,309 unemployment claims were filed, was used as the pre-recession reference point. Claims began spiking upward in June 2008 (21,722) and peaked in December 2009, when 94,091 unemployment claims were filed, an increase of 444 percent from December 2007. By December 2010, monthly claims had fallen back somewhat to 73,040.

As illustrated in Figure 6, *Construction and Extraction Occupations* had the highest number of monthly claims throughout the 42-month period shown in the graph. These construction and oil/gas/mining occupations made up from 13.2 to 20.8 percent of monthly claims during the period shown.



Although a small portion of total claims, *Architecture and Engineering Occupations* showed the greatest increase in claims, up 1,242 percent from December 2007 to the peak in December 2009. The group showing the least percentage impact was *Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Occupations*, with an increase in claims of 154 percent from December 2007 to December 2009.

*Production Occupations* had the greatest improvement in 2010, with unemployment claims down 46 percent, declining from 10,867 in December 2009 (2nd most) to 5,817 (5th most) in December 2010. Five sectors had increases in claims in 2010, led by *Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations* (+9.4 percent).



## REGIONAL

### Northshore Employment

Total employment in the Northshore Region (the five parishes of Livingston, St. Helena, St. Tammany, Tangipahoa, and Washington) was unchanged during the third quarter of 2010, but was 1.5 percent higher compared to the same period in 2009.

The total civilian work force rose 0.4 percent compared to the previous quarter and was 2.2 percent higher year-over-year. The unemployment rate for the third quarter of 2010 was 7.5 percent. In comparison, unemployment

rates were 7 percent in the previous quarter and 6.9 percent during the third quarter of 2009. The unemployment rate went up because the growth in the workforce outpaced the gains in employment.

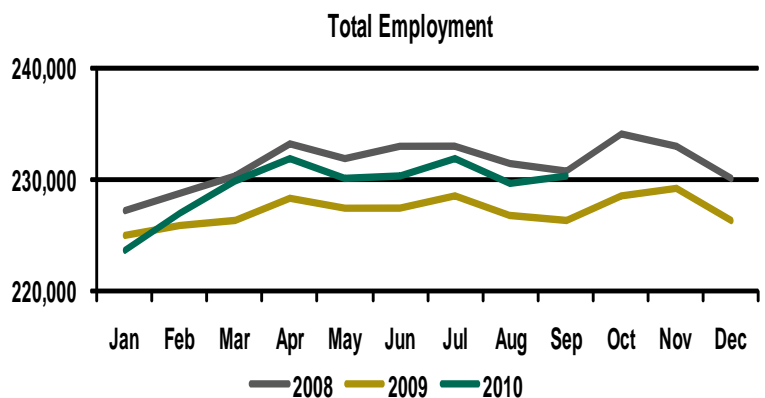

## Estimated Retail Sales in the Northshore Region

Total value of taxable sales in the region fell 3.5 percent from the previous quarter. However, in comparison to the third quarter of 2009, taxable sales were up 0.3 percent.

All of the parishes except St. Helena saw declines in comparison to the previous quarter, and only three were higher year-over-year. The lowest

year-over-year gain occurred in St. Tammany Parish (0.1 percent), while the highest was experienced in Washington Parish (9 percent). St. Helena and Livingston parishes experienced declines year-over-year.

## Residential Building Permits in the Northshore Region

The value of residential building permits in the region for the third quarter of 2010 fell 12.5 percent over the prior quarter and 28.9 percent compared to the third quarter of 2009, projecting a slowdown in construction activities in the coming months.

It should be noted that the value of permits in unincorporated St. Tammany Parish, unincorporated Livingston Parish, and all of St. Helena Parish are based on data (or estimates) provided by the U.S. Census Bureau.

### Livingston Parish

Livingston Parish enjoyed a 1.6 percent gain in employment compared to the third quarter of 2009. However, the labor force rose 2.3 percent, leading to an increase in the unemployment rate to 7.5 percent from 7.1 percent in the second quarter of 2010.

Sales tax collections fell 2.9 percent compared to the third quarter of 2009, in contrast to a regional increase of 0.3 percent.

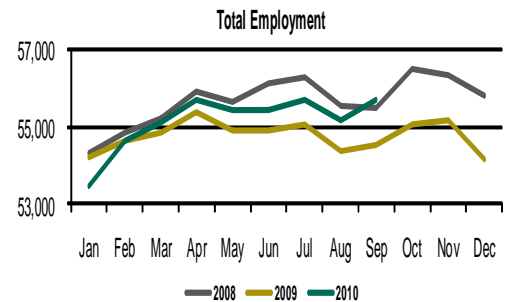
The value of residential building permits fell 36.6 percent compared to the third quarter of 2009, based on data provided by local municipalities and the U.S. Census Bureau.

# Economic Reporter

## St. Helena Parish

Employment in St. Helena in the third quarter of 2010 rose 1.6 percent compared to the same quarter of the previous year. The work force grew by a greater amount (+4.1 percent), leading to an increase in the unemployment rate. The rate climbed to 14.1 percent, up from 12.1 percent for the previous quarter and the highest in the region.

Sales tax collections were up 3.8 percent over the previous quarter, but fell 5 percent year over year, while the region as a whole experienced a slight gain.

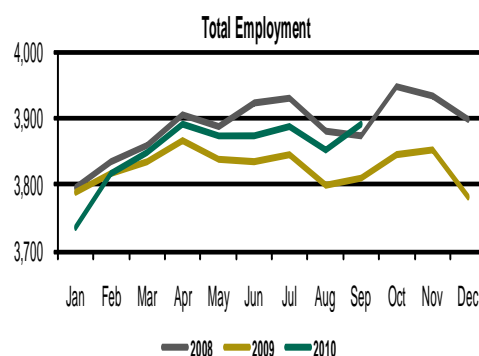

Retail sales rose 0.1 percent compared to the third quarter of 2009, a gain that was below the regional average.

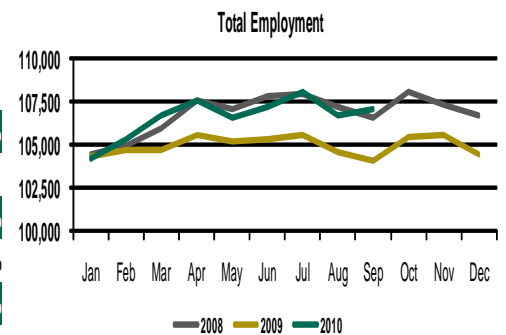

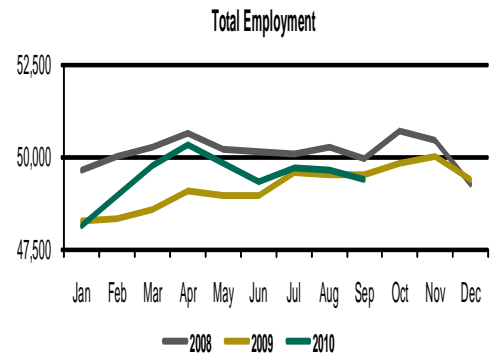
Retail sales rose 1.7 percent compared to the third quarter of 2009, a greater gain than the average for the region.

Sales tax collections were 9 percent higher compared to the third quarter of the previous year, a significantly larger increase than the regional average growth of 0.3 percent.

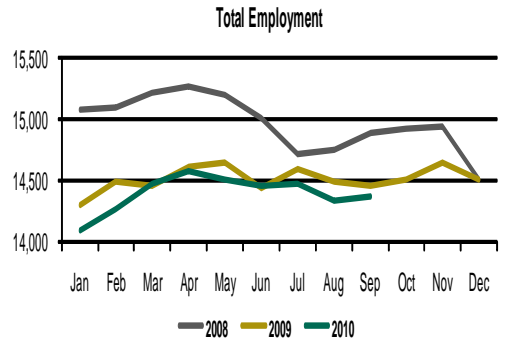
